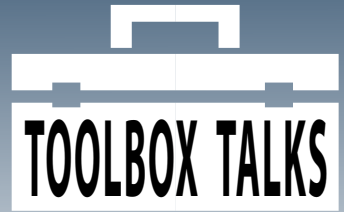


# HAZARD MAPPING



Mapping the hazards in your workplace can help you identify hazards and implement strategies to control them.

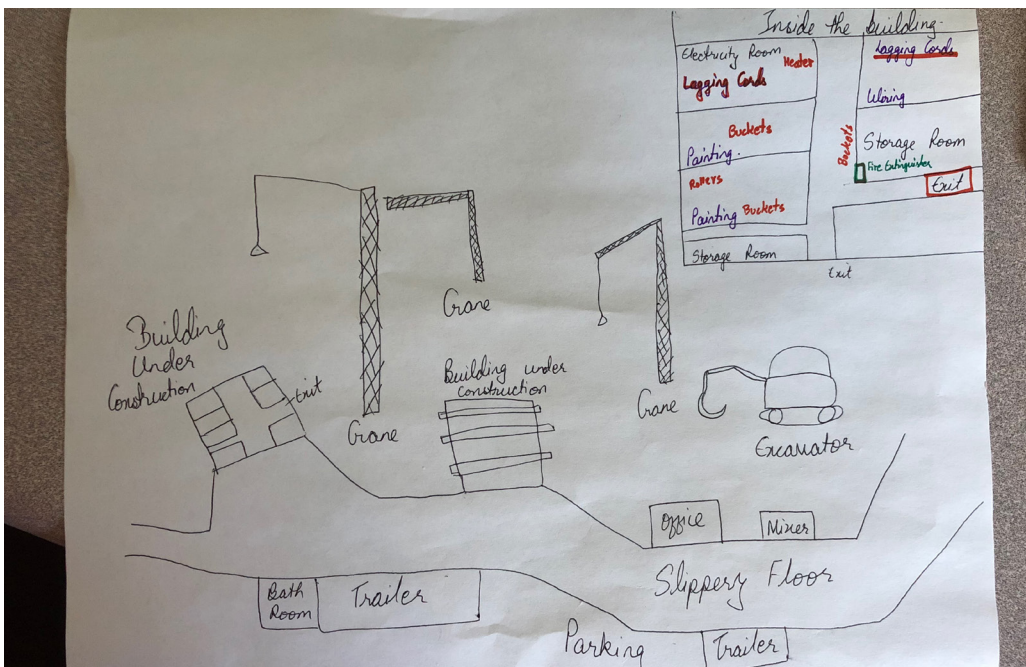

## FLOOR LAYER'S STORY

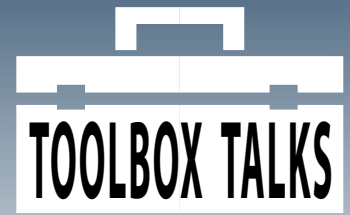

## **DRAW A HAZARD MAP OF YOUR WORKPLACE**

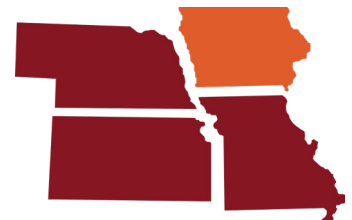
*Step 1:* Draw your workplace.
